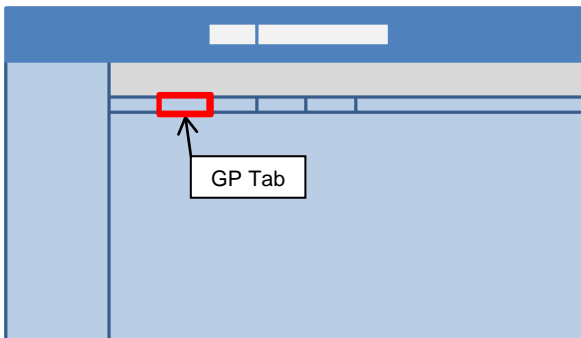


**The GP tab is the second tab that displays when viewing a Single Patient View. This presents the GP information recorded for your patient. The tab will only show for GPs taking part in Leeds Care Record/Yorkshire and Humber Care Record.**

**Where to find the GP information:**

The GP tab will present the patient's GP records in a summary view on the initial page load. This is taken from the GPs live system and presents the same set of information whether they are on SystemOne or EMIS.

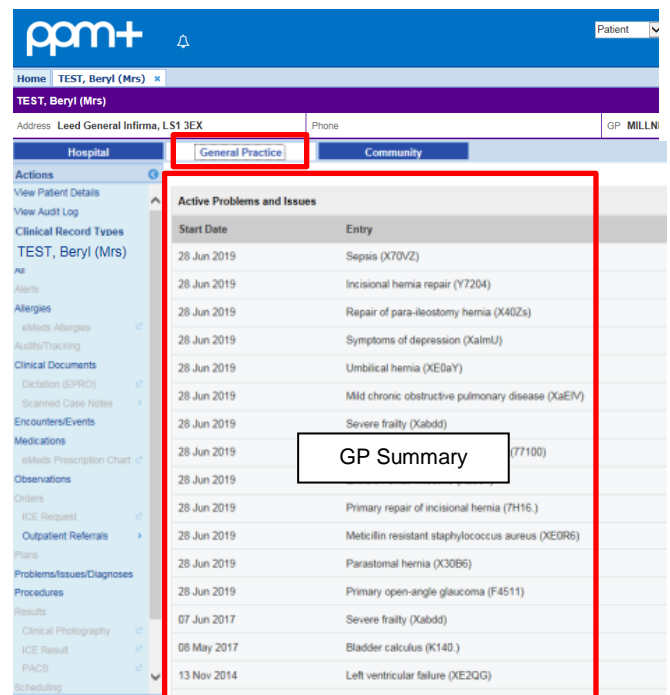
The GP tab will display next to the Hospital tab if the patient is registered with a Leeds GP taking part in Leeds Care Record.



The GP summary lists any Active Problems and Issues, Current Medications, including Acute and Repeat, Current Allergies and Adverse Reactions and the last 3 encounters at the GP Practice.


Click on a category title from the left hand actions column and it will display those clinical items in more detail.

If items are greyed out from the actions bar, this means that the GP does not currently hold data for those Clinical Record Types, or they are not sharing them into the Leeds Care Record.

## Medications:

To view the medications prescribed to your patient from the GP, click the Medications section.

Once the page is loaded, you will be given options to view **Current Medication Issues**, **'Current Repeat Medications'** and **'Past Medications'**.
