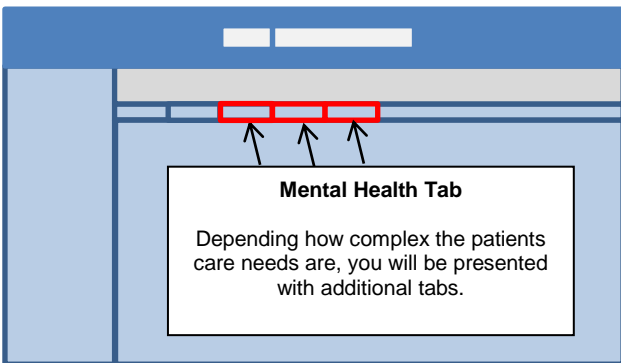


**The Mental Health tab will be displayed if your patient has an open referral or one which has been closed within the last 12 months to Leeds and York Partnership, NHS Foundation Trust (LYPFT), mental health services in Leeds.**

**Where to find the Mental Health information:**

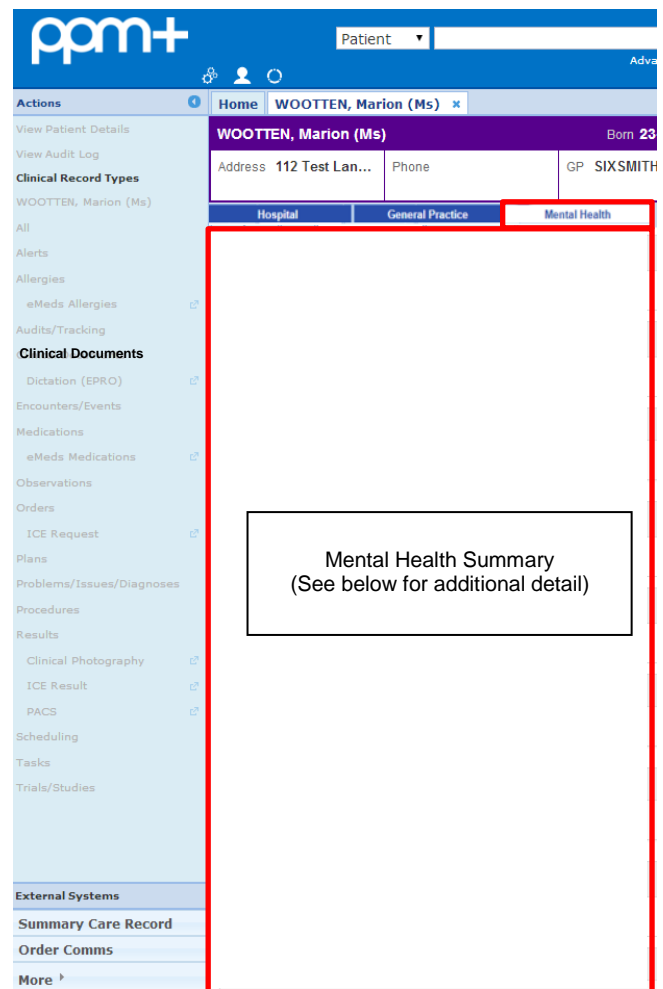
The Mental Health tab will present the patient’s Mental Health records in a summary dashboard style view on the initial page load. This is taken from the LYPFT’s mental health system, Care Director.



It is worthwhile noting that a patient can have multiple Mental Health referrals active at the same time. The information will display if there are various teams working with the patient by separating the contacts onto a new row.

A summary message will be displayed for patients whose LYPFT referrals have been closed within the last 12 months with an accompanying contact number to find out additional detail.

## Explanation of data items

- Alerts present - Alerts are risks as registered on Mental Health information systems.
- Allergies present - Allergies as registered on Mental Health information systems.
- Community Treatment Order present - A Community Treatment Order (CTO) is a provision of the Mental Health Act that obliges a patient to receive supervised community treatment. They can be forcibly recalled to hospital if they fail to comply with its mandatory conditions or should their mental state worsen. The patient cannot be treated against their will unless recalled to hospital. Any changes to their mental health medication must be approved by their Responsible Clinician (Consultant Psychiatrist). Seek advice by calling 0300 300 1485.
- Outpatient appointment - Date and time of next outpatient appointment.
- Community Team Visit - Date of last community visit.
- Ward admission - Ward admission is the date of admission for the last hospital stay.
- Discharge statement - Reason for discharge from hospital care and to who's care they are discharged.
- Advanced statement - An Advanced Statement is a non-legally binding declaration by a capacitous person indicating their care preferences. It must be used by healthcare professionals to guide best interest decisions if the person loses the relevant capacity.
- Care plan - Care Plan is the multidisciplinary plan of Mental Health care. A Care Coordinator is the professional who coordinates the care and maintains the care plan.
