eDID Improvements

Applies to: eDID Users

In line with improving the Trust's discharge processes, we have simplified the eDID (electronic Discharge Initiation Document) process to reduce the time taken to complete a full eDID from 30 minutes to roughly 5 minutes. This will save clinical staff valuable time when sending a referral to the Gateway (formerly known as SPUR) at [Leeds Community Healthcare](#). Please see below for a Referral for Supported Discharge (formerly known as an S2 or Section 2):

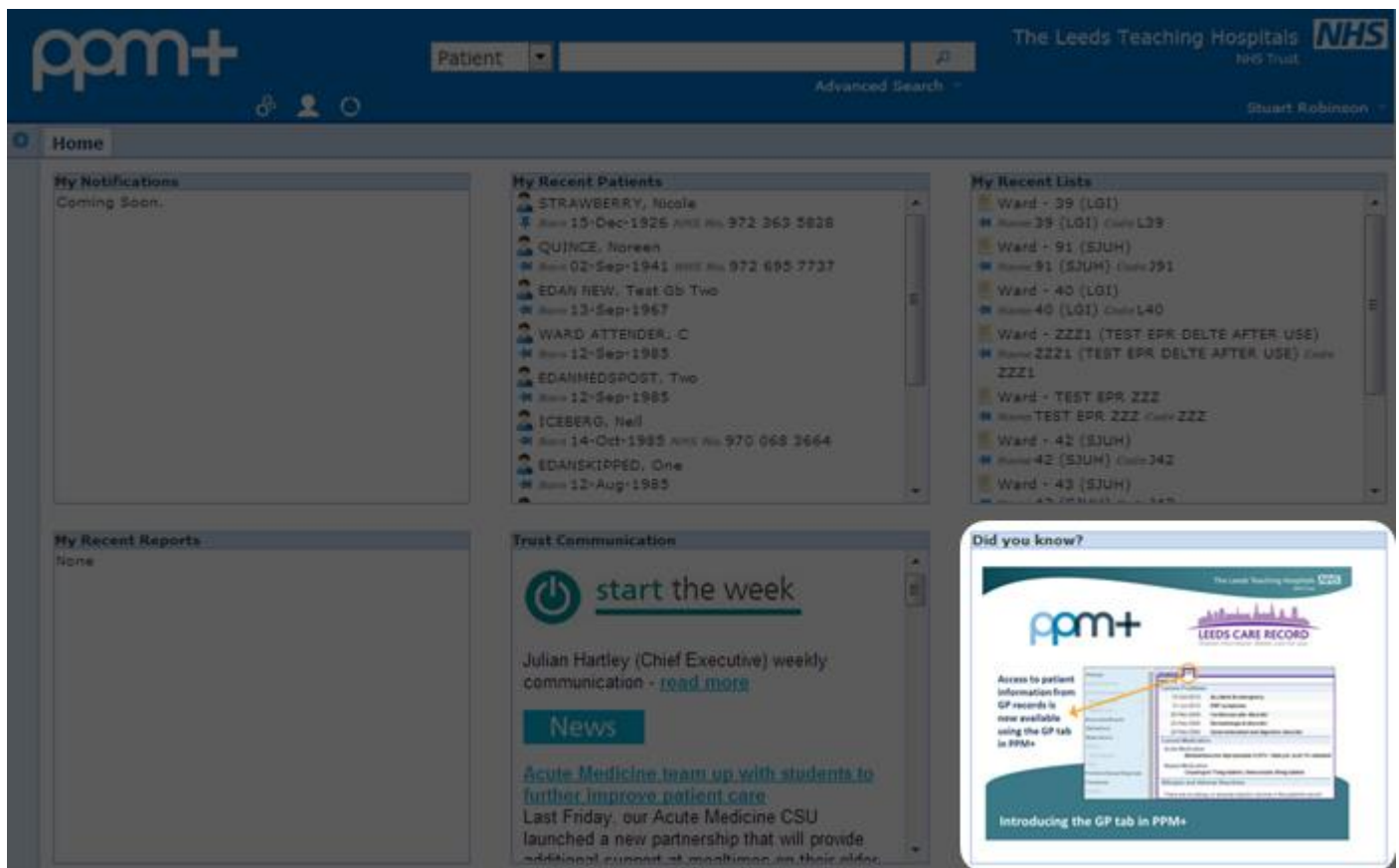

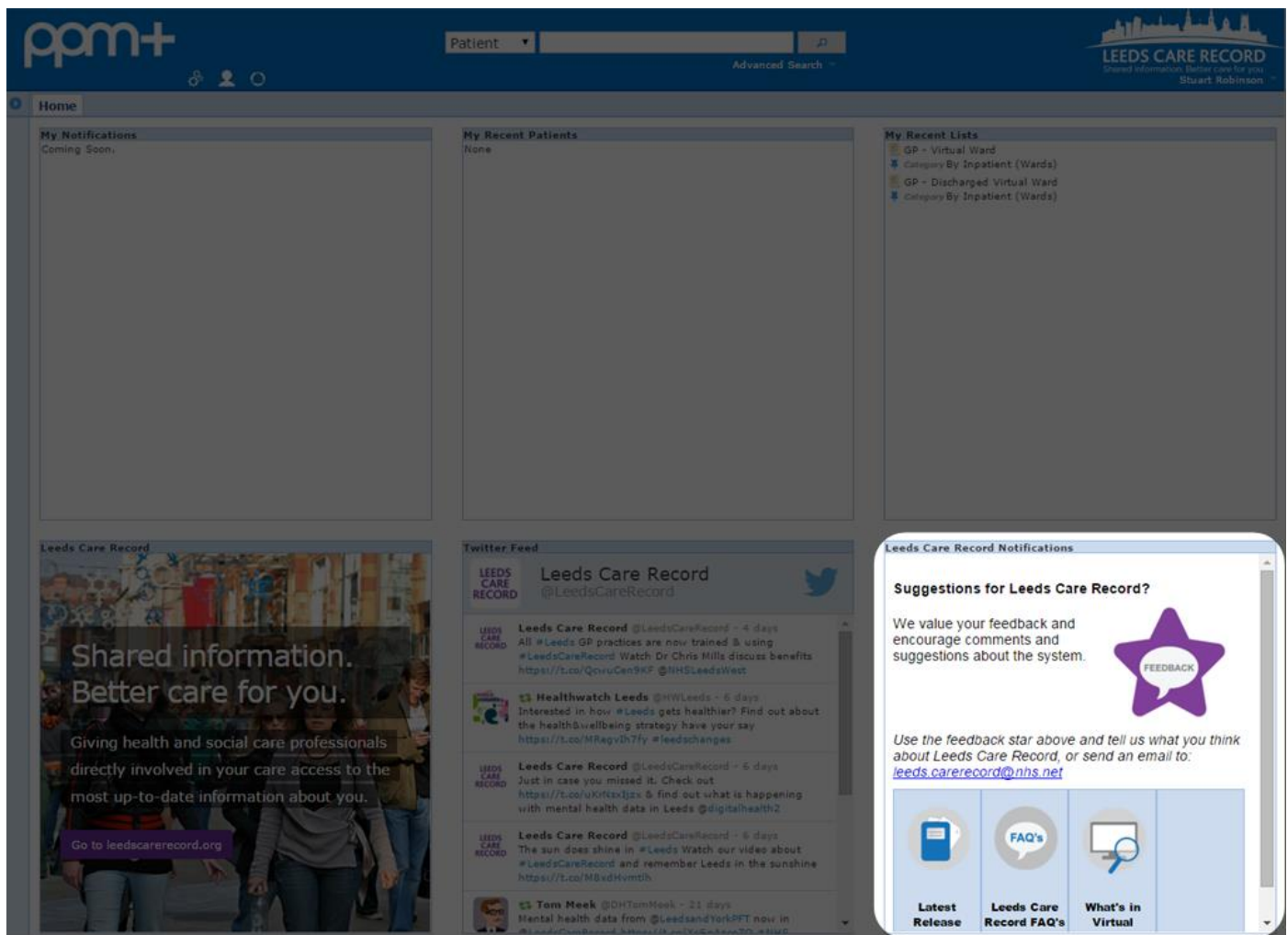


As part of this new version of PPM+, we have added a fix for this problem, which should make accessing the system faster, even at high usage times (typically mid-morning and mid-afternoon).
